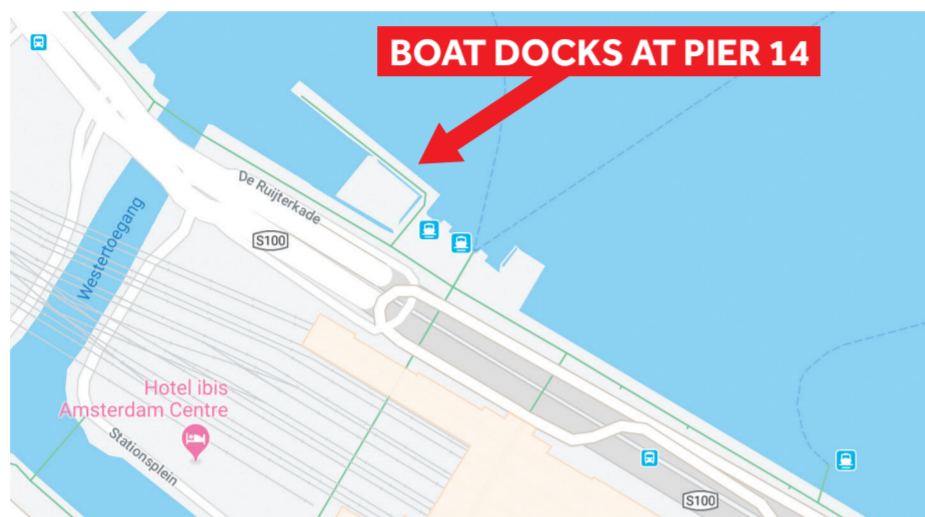
WIFI AT CONFERENCE LOCATION

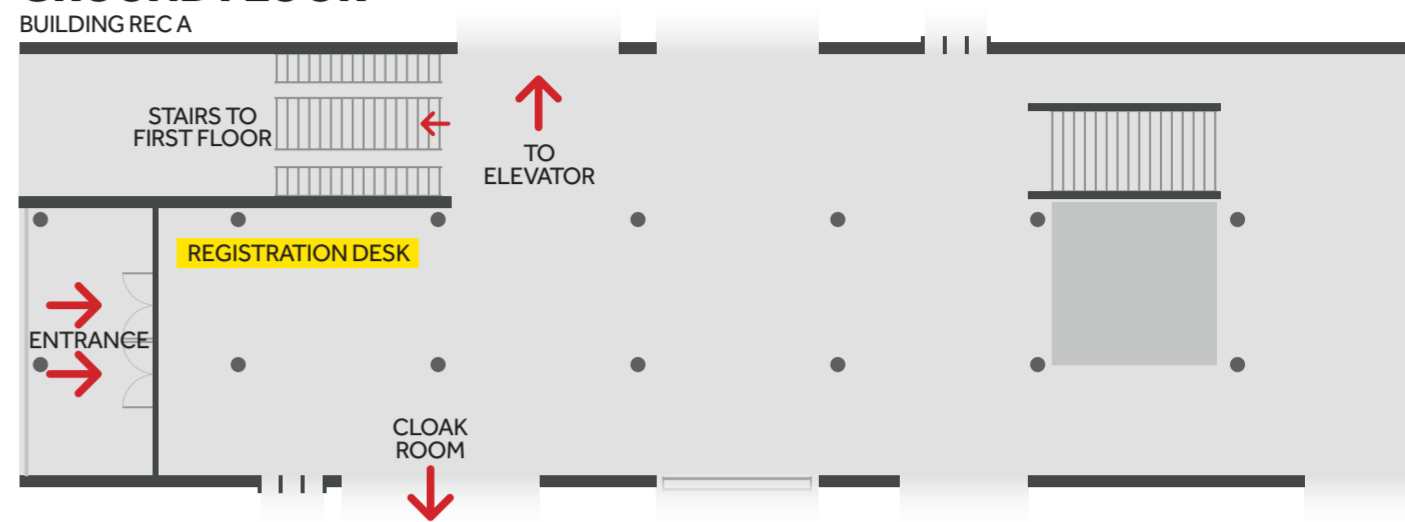
- Please bring cash to buy drinks - we can't guarantee that all cards are accepted. Welcome drink is complementary."

- At the end of the dinner party, the boat will dock at the same location behind Central Station.

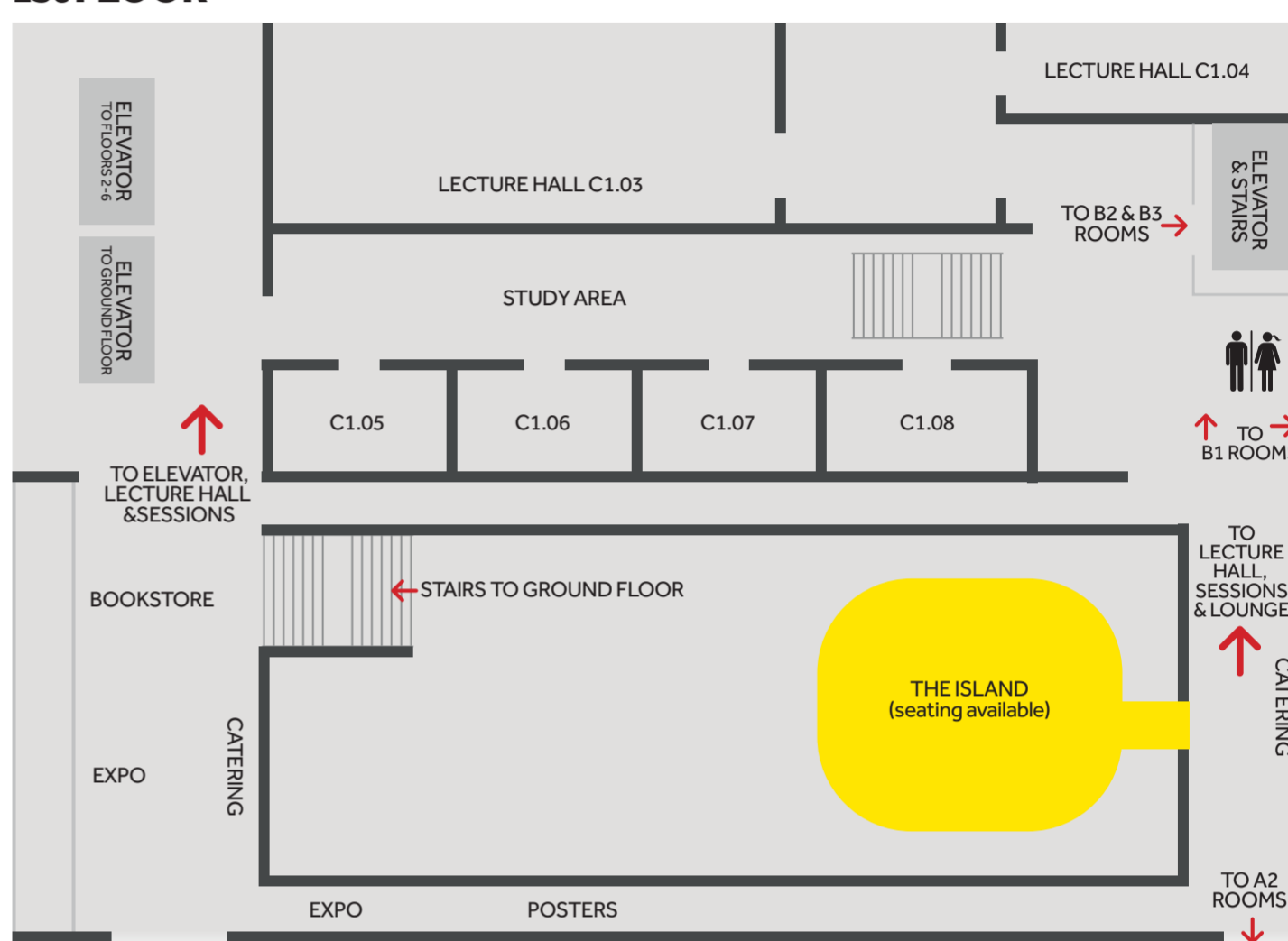
